Tomorrow, our Year Five children will be celebrating the Feast of the Sacred Heart with Mass at 9.00am. They will be accompanied by students from St Monica's College, many of whom are past students. Parents are welcome to attend.

Parish Retreat Day

A flyer went home on Tuesday, alerting you to a Parish Reflection Day on Sunday June 19 from 12 noon – 4 pm. This day will include reflections, discussions and a parish forum for adults. Separate concurrent sessions will be held for younger parishioners (6 – 13 years). This day will also include a communal lunch. Making Appointments during School Time

On Tuesday, we had nine children, spread over all grades, being picked up by parents for outside appointments, all in the space of 15 minutes.

This causes major disruption to the teacher while they are teaching their grade. They have to break off speaking mid-sentence to answer the phone, and then get the child organised with their bag etc, resulting in the other 20+ children losing focus and valuable teaching time. Often the children are at specialists, sport or in the ILC, and numerous phone calls have to be made to find them.

We again request that if you *must* make appointments during school time, that you collect your child five minutes before break times (times are on the 'reflection' page of the newsletter), or at the end of break times.

Morning Drop Off Issues

Unfortunately, there hasn't been any change to the issues we wrote about last week, which is that an increasing number of families are regularly using the staff carpark as a convenient drop off in the morning, and instead of arriving at school on time and using the church 'kiss and drop' or parking on the street, they arrive late, pull up quickly and urge their children to dart around and between other cars, all trying to do the same thing.

Only this morning, the paper recycling truck was forced to block off the road, as some parents blocked the staff carpark entrance with their cars. We need unhindered access through the carpark, especially for deliveries, recycle and rubbish skip trucks.

The staff carpark is not a 'pseudo' kiss and drop.

Please get your children to school on time and use the correct drop area.

If the situation doesn't improve, we will be forced to block off the staff carpark entrance, as we have had to do in the past.

PREMIERS' READING CHALLENGE

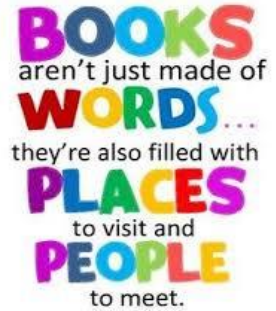

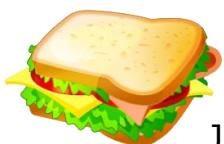
